Decorative 18-20 flowers and foliage may be purchased unless scheduled otherwise. Fresh flowers to be used unless otherwise stated. Embellishments are allowed. Stems to be in water. Children may enter in any section or class.

- 1) 1 cut if large, 3 cuts if small, bulb, corm or rhyzome. NOS
- 2) 1 vase 5 cuts foliage. NND
- 3) 1 vase 3 cuts flowering tree, shrub or climber NOS NND
- 4) 1 cut flowering tree, shrub or climber NOS
- 5) 1 vase 3 cuts same flower NOS
- 6) 1 vase 3 cuts flowering growth DISTINCT NOS
- 7) 1 vase 3 cuts geranium or pelargonium with foliage attached NND
- 8) 1 vase 3 cuts miniature rose NND
- 9) 1 Exhibition Rose

- 10) 1 Container of Foliage Plant/s NOS.
