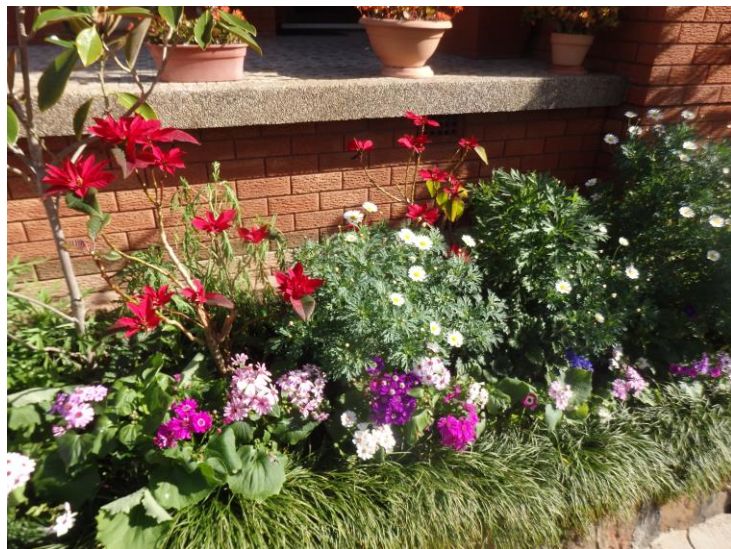

# CITY OF FAIRFIELD GARDEN CLUB SCHEDULE FOR SUNDAY 6th NOVEMBER 2022

## 50<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY MEETING AND HIGH TEA

ALL ENTRIES TO BE STAGED BY 2.00p.m. PROMPT

Classes 1 - 9 Miscellaneous cuts and classes 16-17 Vegetables & Fruit exhibits must be grown by the person/s exhibiting. Classes 10-15 exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor/s for at least 3 months prior to showing (Children 1 month). Decorative 18-21 flowers and foliage may be purchased unless scheduled otherwise. Fresh flowers to be used unless otherwise stated. Embellishments are allowed. Stems to be in water. Children may enter in any section or class.

### CLASS MISCELLANEOUS (to be displayed in supplied vases)

- 1) 1 vase 3 cuts flowering tree, shrub or climber NOS NND.
- 2) 1 cut , if large, 3 cuts if small, bulb, corm or rhizome. NOS
- 3) 1 vase 3 cuts geranium or pelargonium with foliage attached NND.
- 4) 1 cut flowering tree, shrub or climber NOS
- 5) 1 vase 3 cuts of same flower NOS.
- 6) 1 vase 3 cuts same foliage.
- 7) 1 vase 3 cuts Flowering Australian Native/Hybrid Growth NND
- 8) 1 Exhibition Rose
- 9) 1 vase 3 cuts Miniature Rose. NND

### POT PLANTS

- 10) 1 Container Fern/s.
- 11) 1 Container of Flowering Plant/s NOS.
- 12) 1 Container of Foliage Plant/s NOS.
- 13) 1 Container of Bromeliad/s Flowering or Foliage
- 14) 1 Hydroponic Exhibit NOS.
- 15) 1 Container Cactus/i and or Succulent/s

### VEGETABLES AND FRUIT

- 16) One vegetable unit
- 17) One fruit unit

### DECORATIVE

- 18) "Remembrance Day"
- 19) "Spring As You will" Flowers and foliage.
- 20) "Golden Anniversary-Judges Choice" A low table arrangement
- 21) "Golden Anniversary-People's Choice" A low table arrangement .

### Class 20 and 21

Please note 20 and 21 are the same class if you enter class 20 you are deemed to have entered class 21. Class 20 is awarded by the judges and Class 21 is awarded by the Ladies and Gentlemen attending the High Tea. Exhibits are to be displayed on the Tea Tables not on the benches. See also the **POINTS ARE AWARDED AS FOLLOWS** section.

Entries to be left on the bench for at least half an hour after close of meeting for members enjoyment. All members are responsible for removal of their entries and the emptying and putting away of bottles, the replacing of stands, trays and caps they have used to where they belong and for the disposal of entry cards and the removal of award certificates. Thank You.

**POINTS ARE AWARDED AS FOLLOWS:** 1 point is given for each class entered (please note only 1 point per class entered not 1 point per exhibit, so if you enter 5 things in the same class you only get 1 point), Except this month in class 20 you get 2 points for every exhibit because you are automatically deemed to have entered class 21.

**GRAND CHAMPION** 6 Points , 1st Prize 5 Points, 2nd Prize 4 Points, 3rd Prize 3 Points, Highly Commended 2 Points.

If you win a prize in a class you lose your point for entering that class, but you only lose that point once, e.g. if you get 1st, 2nd and 3<sup>rd</sup> in a class you get 12 points for that class.

**EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:** The Show secretary must be informed of all entries so that they can be recorded by 1.55pm and exhibits must be staged by 2.00pm prompt, !!!! -- no exemptions.

### DEFINITIONS:

**NND** not necessarily distinct. (They can be the same).

**NOS** not on schedule. (E.g. if you are entering the "1 cut Flowering Tree, Shrub or Climber" it must not be an Australian Native or Rose because there is a class for them on the schedule.

**DISTINCT** means different. (Same genus of flower, different colour, is not Distinct)
