Decorative 18-20 flowers and foliage may be purchased unless scheduled otherwise. Fresh flowers to be used unless otherwise stated. Embellishments are allowed. Stems to be in water. Children may enter in any section or class.

- 1) 1 Vase 3 Cuts Chrysanthemums. NND
- 2) 1 Vase 3 Cuts Flowering Tree, Shrub or Climber NOS NND
- 3) 1 Vase 3 cuts Foliage DISTINCT
- 4) 1 Vase, 3 Cuts if small, 1 cut if Large, Bulb, Corm or Rhyzome NOS SAME.
- 5) 1 Vase 3 Cuts Flowering Growth NOS.
- 6) 1 Vase 3 cuts Flowering Australian Native/Hybrid Growth NND
- 7) 1 Vase 3 cuts Foliage SAME
- 8) 1 Vase 3 Cuts Geranium or Pelargonium with Foliage Attached. NND
- 9) 1 Vase 3 Cuts Roses NND

POT PLANTS

- 10) 1 Container Geranium/s or Pelargonium/s Flowering or Foliage.
- 11) 1 Container of Foliage Plant/s NOS.
- 12) 1 Container of Flowering Plant/s NOS
- 13). 1 Container Fern/s

NOS not on schedule. (E.g. if you are entering the "1 cut Flowering Tree, Shrub or Climber" it must not be an Australian Native or Rose because there is a class for them on the schedule.

DISTINCT means different. (Same genus of flower, different colour, is not Distinct)
